



We today received a call from a Mr. Whittet representing Mr. G.T. Chillcott, Chief Engineer, B.C. Department of Transport in regard to reconditioning of our Old Glory Lookout telephone line.

As you are aware, since 1941 the Meteorological Division. D.O.T., have had permission to utilize our line for purposes of communication with their station at the summit of the mountain -see our letter of September 11th of that year, copy of which was forwarded for your file. Mr. Whittet points out that with their weather station on a 12 months operation basis, while they do have radio, they feel it essential that they likewise have a dependable telephone communication for emergencies when the radio may be unserviceable. He states that our line is workable most of the time. but would be much improved with a comparatively small expenditure on maintenance and relocation in some places. Dependent upon availability of certain materials from stock in the engineering division, the cost of such improvements might vary from \$400 to \$1000. It is the D.O.T.'s suggestion that we co-operate in the matter of cost of such renovation if at all possible.

We advised Mr. Whittet that we operate an S.P.F. on Old Glory and so far as we were aware, the telephone was becoming more or less a secondary means of communication on our work. It was also pointed out that we had need of the line only about four months in the year. Further, that dependent upon the amount of use we were getting out of the telephone line and your anticipated future use, we would give consideration to their proposition. Mr. Chillcott is to write us a letter for file when he has full detail on cost, putting forth the proposition in detail. Meanwhile, would you kindly let us have your comments as to whether we should co-operate in this work. It occurred to us here that with the inconsistencies of radio reception, especially in fire weather, the telephone should at least be kept in service for our work. If this is so, it might be that we could very well contribute a share towards the renovation costs in the form of labour or materials, our share to be pro-rated on the basis of period of the year which we operate as compared with the D.O.T.

Attention Operation

Referring to your letter of June 18th, we are interested to hear that the Department of Transport wishes to reconstruct the Old Glory Lockout telephone line. We do not have an S.F.F. set on Old Glory as you have thought and are entirely dependent on the phone line for lockout reports. Ranger Nichols has reported that the Department of Transport have been most cooperative in their use of our line, for instance, replacing a mile of it themselves last year and paying the telephone company rental charges. In view of this we think that we should cooperate with them and pay a fair share of the cost of reconstruction.

What troubles us is the matter of funds. As you know, from your discussion with Mr. Gormely, \$1400.00 of our maintenance funds are earmarked pending the decision on the Kootenay River bridge. As a result we have had no funds to spare for projects such as this and have notified the Rangers, including Ranger Nichols, that this type of maintenance work would have to be done by Forest Service labor. We think the project is worthwhile enough, however, for the Forest Service to spend two or three hundred dollars on and if we can reduce the amount held for the Kootenay River bridge to \$1200.00 we can provide \$200.00 for this project. We think this is the best thing to do as the Kootenay River bridge can not be tackled until the fall and the situation may be a little clearer by then after the Public Works bridge engineer has made his report.

A discussion took place with your Mr. Bassett regarding the present telephone line to the summit of Old Glory Mountain.

As you are aware, this Department operates a Meteorological Station at the peak of this mountain adjacent to your forestry lookout. Our operators are resident at this point 12 months of the year whilst your personnel occupy the lookout for approximately 3 months during the summer.

In the past, there has been considerable difficulty keeping the line in good working order due to snow and rock slides near the summit. It has been recommended by our Engineering Branch that a lead covered armoured cable be used for the first 3,000' from the summit downwards to by-pass the worse spots and also to endeavour to obtain 100% service. It has been estimated that the cost of providing and installing this cable will be in the neighbourhood of \$1300.00 and as it is your line in the first place, although permission has been given this Department to use it for the greatest period of the year, we feel that you should be approached for permission to make the abovementioned change, and also to inquire as to whether you would be willing to assume a portion of the cost of the revision.

It is believed that your Department are using radio communications most of the time, as is the case with this Department, but the telephone line is essential due to failures of radio equipment and also as an emergency when calling for help.

Reference is made to your letter of the 7th instant in connection with proposed improvement of Old Glory Lockout telephone line, our Forest Service Project No. 419.

The contents of your letter were referred to our District Forester at Nelson for comment and recommendation. The District Forester advises us that your proposals for installing armoured cable over one of the worst stretches of the line is a very definite needed improvement insofar as consistent usage of the line is concerned. He points out, however, that the line is in use by this Service for only about two and one-half months in each year as a supplement to radio communication and on that basis, any large expenditure of funds towards new location or renewal does not appear economical.

We note your estimate of \$1,300 as the cost of the proposed work and on the basis of the foregoing, if the work is undertaken by your Department, we would be agreeable to contributing to the extent of \$300 of the cost, which proportion is roughly pro rata on the basis of our two and one-half months usage as compared with the Meteorological Department's year round usage of the line. Our contribution could take the form of coverage of labour payroll or preferably, purchase of material up to the above-mentioned amount.

We would be pleased to hear your reaction to this proposal at an early date so that if the work is to be proceeded with, we may plan accordingly.

As you are probably aware, the Red Mountain Ski Club Society is at present completing a large project on the north side of Red Mountain, near Rossland. The Club is incorporated as a non-profit society and exists solely for the promotion of ski-ing in this district. At present we have under construction a ski-lift 1400 feet high and 4,000 feet long, by far the largest in Canada. Other developments include a downhill run alongside the lift, a large ski lodge at the foot of the hill, and an all-weather road to the lodge. The accompanying map shows the location of the project relative to Rossland.

We are most anxious to establish telephone communication between the lodge and Rossland. Our thought is that we may be able to run a telephone line, as shown in blue on the map, from the lodge, to connect with the forestry department's line (shown in green) to the Old Glory lookout. We would have about 3,000 feet of line to run, and would connect to your line just north of the Trail Ski Club cabin.

Such an arrangement would, of course, mean that your line would become a party line. It is quite understandable that you will have objections to this. We would like to point out, however, that during the fire season our phone would be used very little. Also, we already have our own phone line up the lift, connecting the lodge to the top of Red Mountain, and this might be of considerable value to you in spotting and fighting fires. The use of our lift would be available to you for transporting men and supplies to the top of Red Mountain if ever required.

Our Meteorological staff on Old Glory Mountain ski into Rossland once a month in the winter by way of Squaw Valley.

Prior to the formation of the Red Mountain Ski Club, a good deal of skiing was done in Squaw Valley and a trail was brushed out the length of the valley - a distance of about five miles.

Since little skiing is done in Squaw Valley this ski trail has grown up with willow and vines. It is quite hazardous for skiing, especially on account of the vines and our Old Glory staff has complained on several occasions after breaking skis.

We would like to brush out the willow and vines on this trail during the next two months with our Old Glory staff. No burning of any kind would be done and there would not be any accumulation of slash. Not more than three days would be required for this work.

Would you kindly advise this office at your earliest convenience if we may have your permission to brush out the Squaw Valley ski trail.

On a recent trip to the Kootenays, our Regional Meteorological Inspector, Mr. E.D.M. Williams, made a visit to your District Forester in connection with the telephone line which has been used jointly by your summer Lookout on Old Glory Mountain, near Rossland, B.C. and our year-round Meteorological Observing Station on the same peak.

As you know, the single-wire line was built by your Service about 1930 from the outskirts of Rossland, where it connects with the B.C. Telephone Company's facilities. Since the establishment of our weather station in the early 1940's, we have shared its use. Over the past ten years, in order to reduce breakages of the line by winter storms and other causes, we have at our own expense progressively replaced portions of the upper part of the line by two-wire armoured cable. By now, the cable extends from the summit down to the packtrain base camp, with a branch to our emergency cabin on Record Ridge.

The lower part of the line, which remains single-wire over a distance of between five and six miles, between the packer's camp and the connection with B.C. Telephone lines, is in a dilapidated condition and evidently will need considerable repair or replacement soon. The matter of ownership and responsibility is thus of importance, and this was discussed by your District Forester at Nelson, B.C. with our Mr. Williams in October 1959.

Your letter of February 11th addressed to the District Forester at Nelson has been forwarded to this office for reply.

We are pleased to release any rights that this Department may have in the phone line serving the Old Glory Lookout and your Meterological Station to your Department.

We have been unable to find any easements or agreements with other parties but would advise that the Red Mountain Ski Club Society, P.O. Box 43, Rossland, B.C., have been connected to the line since 1948. A proposed agreement calling for them to jointly maintain the portion of the line they use in co-operation with your Department during the winter does not seem to have been answered. Possibly such co-operation has been forthcoming over the years.

There is no agreement with the Department of Highways for using any portion of the public R/W from Rossland to the south boundary of Lot 1657 Kootenay near Gebbard's Camp, nor is there any pole line easement on our files. Seemingly, like many such early projects we have placed our improvements while the greater part was undeveloped Crown land.

The route is approximately positioned on the attached sketch.

We have been advised that you are abandoning your location on Old Glory and will have your equipment moved out this summer. Could you advise whether this abandonment is of a temporary or permanent nature. If permanent, we would certainly be interested in your buildings on the site. If available, what procedure would be necessary in our acquiring them?

As you know, we have a Lookout on Old Glory. This project is covered by a lease and it would be a very simple matter to have it extended to include your area.

We are changing our radio system from an AM to FM network. With the latter network for efficient operation, it is necessary to have suitably located repeater sites. At the present time we do not have a link into the Arrow Lakes. Old Glory would fill this gap and possibly do away with three of our present sites. You can see why we are interested in this location.

Ranger Wood advises that the Department of Transport is going to abandon its weather station on Old Glory. It is their intention to have all their equipment moved out by the end of July.

In the meantime it might be advisable to check regarding their future plans at this location. If this abandonment is going to be permanent, then we should make arrangements to take over their holdings (reserve and buildings).

It has been rumored that other concerns, such as C.M. & S. Co. Ltd., and Highways, will be interested. Such being the case, we should get the jump on them and get our word in first.

Old Glory, if we can get suitable economical power, is our answer to getting into the Arrow Lakes with F.M. radio. It would eliminate at least one, if not two, repeaters to complete this communication leg. Wilf Rogers also advises that an installation on Old Glory could possibly do away with repeaters at Santa Rosa, Red Mountain and Thompson. This installation would be quite expensive initially and difficult to service, especially in the winter. If we could interest the West Kootenay in a co-operative effort, then no doubt a power line and a road would go in.

REMARKS:

Phoned Wilf Gibbard and found out that the D.O.T. layed out ground wires for their phone system quite a few years ago but the phone line no longer exists. They replaced it a few years ago with radio-tel. Wilf figured that there are only about 2 miles of the 6 - 7 mile long line left, scattered in small sections. Prior to the ground line was of course telephone poles. The maintenance and repair to keep it in service were tremendous and so it was abandoned. There are apparently no poles standing anymore on the rocky ridges.

As form the cabin, it is located half way up Wilf's pack trail not on F.S. trail. It is about 2 miles from the top. Wilf said that it was still in fair shape a year ago but was having a hard time keeping the public out.

Because of the high cost of reinstalling a telephone line and maintaining it, plus the problems we will encounter in keeping the cabin intact, I feel, for the amount of useage, there would be no point in retaining interest. Hughie is on holidays but I'm quite certain he would agree.

Dear Mr. Johnston,

There appears to have been some work done towards estlanding an escisting logging road located south of Hamma Greek on to the ridge at the head of the valley. Since the beginning of the road has been posted this year as a farest Service Lookout road I am wondering if the ultimate intention is to push the road along the ridge, across the intervening valley and on to the main ridge of Old Glory. The Lookout of course is situated on the summit of Old Glory.

I am most interested in learning your plans for road access into the Old Glory area since, as you are probably aware, this is probably one of the most popular liking trips in the Trail-Roseland area.

The Old Glony trail system has undergone drastic change during the last 8 years; first by the construction of the main highway and later by the logging operation that intually wifed out much of the old pack hase trail. The shorter direct trail to the ridge is still a most pleasant hike, but much of the enjoyment would be last if the trail were to intersect a road along the ridge creat continuing on to the main massif of Old Glony. The old pack horse trail, custailed though it is by the logging operation, is still most enjoyable particularly along the ridge, and especially in the early runner when the flowers are at their best.

If it is indeed true that a road is planned to Old Glory, my first reaction would be to object on the grounds that such a road would be an in-recessory intrusion into a delightful area already possessing on excellent and well-used trail access. However I would fish like to hear of your plans, and if road access is to be extended I am interested in your justification for mad a move.

My original plan was to take a day or two and completely escape from the wrath of city life. I just wanted to get out of all the noise and pollutants, and away from those traffic lights and parking meters.

I was enjoying my hike to the fullest when disaster struck. It was on the slopes of the summit when my eyes first came upon hitter and trash of all sorts.

I was shocked, for here I was, standing on the summit of a 7,800-foot mountain, four or five miles from the nearest road, and still I could not escape from the disgusting habits of mankind.

From my topographical map, I assumed there would simply be a small neat lookout post, situated on the summit. Much to my disgust, bricks, boards, bottles and wire formed a stream of trash two hundred yards down the mountainside. There was an old cement foundation which held rusted metal junk of all sorts. Old rusted motors, along with parts, lay strewn over the ground. On the north-
